  - Joint Council Meeting April 12 @ 5:30
    - The next Joint Board of Trustees/School Council meeting is scheduled for April 12 at the Education Centre. This dinner meeting, running from 5:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m., will include welcome and introductions by Board Chair Todd Brand, followed by greetings from Superintendent Greg Luterbach. Highlights of the evening include a focus group on parental involvement in the decision-making process about their children, the role of school councils, and RVS' Four Year Plan development.   - School Education Plan
    - We continue to work on the SEP
    - In the past, we have mirrored the division's 4 year plan

Trustee: Norma Lang

- RVS was not given any new schools from the new gov't budget. With our enrollment increase, we will need more space. Hopefully, we will receive some portables, but this has not been confirmed yet.
- Crossfield is on the list for a 600 student school, but it won't be needed for a while and is dependent on gov't funding.
- RVS Trustees will be meeting with Crossfield Town Council this month regarding managing growth.
- The Board has set budget priorities and is working towards creating a budget in May.
- Transportation is still a large budget issue, and the board will be making a
  decision regarding this on Thursday of this week. The most popular
  bundle (Bundle 1) included double runs of bus routes. Crossfield school
  should see minimal impact. Airdrie and Cochrane will experience the
  largest change with bell times and bus ride lengths.

### Old Business: (Items from last meeting):

- Is there a possibility of having crossing guards at the crosswalk that goes from the back of the school field across Whitfield? This is a busy area before and after school for both walking students and parents in vehicles. Bob will speak to the MRP for patrols.
  - o Trevor, our peace officer has been monitoring this area
  - o There was also a facebook post addressing this and had positive responses
  - o There seems to be some improvement
  - We are looking into adding more permanent signage for the area in addition to another set of sandwich boards that will be put out during loading times.
- Attendance discussion from last meeting- it is on our radar and we are looking at doing something to recognize perfect attendance, possibly a monthly draw to recognize and celebrate attendance. Perfect attendance day- a day in which all students and staff are in attendance will be celebrated should it happen.
  - Perhaps a coupon for the book fair/ chapters card
  - o This is still in the beginning stages and has not yet started.
  - Our school currently has 4 or 5 students that have perfect attendance this school year.

#### **New Business:**

- June meeting will be an AGM. Shari will have the report completed for the end of June, Amy will provide the financials.
- Baseball Diamonds
  - o Community use after hours, however there is no way to reserve them.
    - Update: there is a way to reserve these spaces. Our local, non-profit, community based groups are able to fill out an application and submit to RVS in order to book
  - The division maintains it but we are unaware of the schedule.
  - o Is there a chance of getting shale added to the baselines?
    - Update: the quote was \$5000 from the Town so the Ball Association is no longer pursuing this
  - Learn to Play program and T-Ball has grown so having a useable diamond would be beneficial to the community

- Is there a way that the school can provide some resources for parents looking to provide additional help for students (OT, Speech, tutoring, etc)
  - Likely Community Links, Boys & Girls Club
  - The ATA restricts teachers from tutoring students under their care and Bob suggests that any teacher in this building should not tutor students in our school
