### Reports:

Chair: Krista White

- 1. Attended the joint school council meeting on Nov. 15.
  - a. Discussed parental concerns and positives, including mental health support. Many of the same concerns that parents brought up re: bullying, mental health
  - b. Also discussed revisions to school councils to include kindergarten parents.
  - c. 4 year plan was discussed
  - d. Alberta School Council Association conference April 27-28 in Edmonton. The board has a fund that we can apply for to send members to the conference. We can apply for up to \$2000 to cover associated costs
- Town Council liaison: Liz Grace
  - 1. Traffic: suggestions on changing procedures on the South and North side of the school.
    - a. The plan is to make Mountain Ave (Sask Street to Alberta Street) no parking on the South side during school hours, partly because snow removal is difficult for the public works crew.
    - b. Town council will petition RVS Board of Trustees to pave the high school lot in order to make it more accessible and useful
    - c. On the North side of the street, from the arena to the East side of the crosswalk directly in front of the school would be a drop off only zone on Mountain Ave
    - d. The North side of the school yard will be bus parking from Monday to Friday 7-9:30am and 1-5pm. This will allow kindergarten parents to still park there during 12:00 pm pick up times.



  - 1. Land Acknowledgement Statement
    - The Board of Trustees approved a Land Acknowledgement Statement at its Nov. 29, 2018, Board Meeting. The statement serves as an act of reconciliation and is meant to honour and respect both the land and the Indigenous Peoples in our local area.
    - Bob read the statement to members of the council.
      - The statement reads, "Rocky View Schools acknowledges and recognizes all the Indigenous Peoples whose footprints have marked these lands from time immemorial. Together, we can learn and honour the ways of knowing of Indigenous Peoples, and all peoples, for future generations."
      - The establishment of the Land Acknowledgement Statement responds to the Government of Canada's Truth and Reconciliation Commission Call to Action, as well as Alberta Education's desire to enhance First Nations, Métis, and Inuit perspectives throughout the curriculum.
