Green Dot Days:

At times of severe, inclement weather a "Green Dot Day" will be declared. A green dot is placed in the entrance windows to signify inclement weather; when children may wait in the boot room prior to school.



Recess

Permission to stay in at recess:

All students will eat lunch at their

own desk in their homeroom. One

adult supervises each wing

(4-5 classrooms).

We encourage all students to go out for some fresh air at recess breaks.

At times of severe, inclement weather students will be allowed back into the building earlier or an indoor recess may be called.

A note from the parent is required each day the child is requested to remain indoors at recess.

Leaving the school grounds at noon:

Students who stay at school for lunch must NOT leave the school grounds at noon without a dated note signed by a parent or primary care giver.

Playground Information

Playground Boundaries

Boundaries for our playground are the chainlink fences on the south, west, and north sides, and the trees between W.G. Murdoch and CES.

Our playground is shaped like a giant L. It consists of five distinct areas:

- 1. West asphalt pad with pad games
- 2. West playing fields and ball diamond
- 3. North playing fields
- 4. Two playground structures,
- 5. Natural play area.

Playground Equipment

A limited amount of playground equipment such as game balls, play balls, skipping ropes, etc. will be provided by the school in an equipment bin.

Students borrowing equipment are responsible for the care of this equipment.

Due to safety concerns students may not bring wooden baseball bats, full size hockey sticks, regulation pucks and hard balls, or skateboards to school.

Bicycle and Scooter Racks

Bike and scooter racks are provided for those students who choose to ride to school. The bike and scooter racks are out of bounds to the students during the school day.

For safety reasons, students should "WALK their wheels" off school property and along the bus-loading zone when leaving school. Helmets are recommended.

Town Students—After School

For safety's sake, town students are to return home immediately after school. Students are welcome to return to the playground once they have checked in at home.

Playground Supervision

Playground areas are supervised...

- Before school 8:30am-8:40am
- During recess
- After school 3:25pm-3:35pm
- Fridays after school 1:40pm-1:50pm

There is at least one teaching staff member supervising during each of these times. In addition, there are as many as three other adult

While we strive to keep everyone's property safe and secure, some things invariably get lost. We ask that you check to make sure all of your child's belongings are clearly marked for easy identification. Students should not bring expensive items to school.

Our lost and found box, for most large objects, is located at the front doors. Very small or valuable objects are kept at the office.

Guest/Visitor Protocol

At CES we strive to be an open and welcoming part of our community, and we also need to be aware of student safety. For that reason, I would like to review a few of our protocols for guests in the school and on the school grounds.

Visitors in the school:

We love to have guests and volunteers visiting our school, and ask that everyone adhere to the following:

*Guests and volunteers must check in at the front desk upon entering the school.

*Volunteers must have a valid criminal record check with vulnerable sector check.

*Visitors must always be accompanied by a staff member.

*You will be expected to obtain and wear a visitor's tag at all times while in the school.

*Guests and visitors must enter and exit only through the front door.

*While we appreciate the support of visitors and volunteers, we respectfully ask that instruction time is not interrupted.

Visitors on the school ground:

We have lots of families who walk with their children to school and then stay to visit before and after the school day. We enjoy having the chance to chat with our CES community members and are happy to have the visitors! Should a visitor see something of concern such as a student altercation, we ask that you:

*Alert a staff supervisor so that they can address the problem

*Speak to the students and ask them to stop the unsafe activity.

*Please either go yourself or ask a student to get help from the office or find a supervisor.

*Do not try to intervene to break up a fight or separate the students yourself.

*Our staff are trained in de-escalation strategies and any intervention should be left to them.

Dogs on the school ground:

Some of our visitors like to walk their dogs when they come to the school to drop off or pick up their students. However, we ask that dog owners keep in mind the following:

> Dog owners on school grounds are subject to the regulations in the Town of Crossfield Dog Control Bylaw 2017-13 at all times.

Dogs are the responsibility of their owner.

Dogs must be leashed and kept fully under control at all times while on the school grounds.

Dogs which are deemed aggressive or unsafe will be asked to be taken off the school grounds.

Supervision times:

The school provides outdoor supervision of students starting at 08:30am and lasting until 3:35pm. We ask that students not be left alone at the school before 08:30am or after 3:35pm.

Thank you for your support in keeping our students safe!

Home Learning Activities— Homework

Home learning activities may be assigned to support and extend the learning that is taking place at school. We encourage parents to initiate conversations with their children about their daily learning. Home reading on a daily basis is an expectation of all students in our school. You can make a profound difference in your child's ability to read by spending fifteen minutes per day with them reading good books together. As children advance in grades the home learning activities may become more of their weekly routine. Agendas will be used to record what learning activities are assigned for work at home. Some of these activities will facilitate collaboration and conversation about learning with parents and siblings. Thank you for helping and monitoring your child with the completion of home learning activities.

Assessment:

The process of learning is continuous throughout the life of an individual. We recognize no two children are alike and they develop at different rates. Assessment and descriptive feedback, which focuses on children's growth, facilitates the development of self-confidence and provides motivation for continued learning. Report cards reflect both your child's growth as an individual and your child's achievement relative to provincial curriculum.

Student Conduct

Student Responsibilities

Crossfield Elementary School prides itself as a caring, sharing, and safe environment. Anger is a normal human emotion and young children need support in regulating and responding appropriately to it. Parents are asked to review these responsibilities with their children each year.

Everyone in Crossfield Elementary School is expected to assume these responsibilities.

Be considerate. Treat others, as you would like to be treated.

Be friendly and use good manners. Listen to others.

Be respectful. Know and follow the rules. Respect other's rights and responsibilities. Know that you are a special person, as are all the others in this school.

Be safe. Do not harm yourself or others. Do not bring unsafe items to school. Avoid rough or aggressive games. Report any unsafe activity to a teacher or supervisor.



Kindness, Safety, Respect, Growth

Non-Negotiables

Crossfield School has six school rules that deal with serious, unacceptable behavior. These rules are called non-negotiable rules. The nonnegotiable rules identify behavior which will not be accepted under any circumstances.

We do not tolerate fighting, physical or verbal aggression toward anyone under any circumstances.

We do not tolerate defiance of authority.

We do not tolerate profane or indecent language.

We do not tolerate willful damage to or theft of property.

We do not tolerate continual disruptive behavior.

There will be no weapons, or items that can be physically dangerous allowed at school.

Procedures:

- Students will be helped to understand why inappropriate behavior is unacceptable.
- They will be guided in solving the problems they have created.
- They will be encouraged toward self-discipline and responsibility for their actions.
- Home and school will work together to help students grow and develop into socially responsible persons.
- Friendology Program is used school wide for peer conflict resolution and a common language among the students and staff.

We attempt to use logical consequences for misbehavior and to exercise justice and fair play. Our emphasis is on helping and encouraging personal accountability and acceptance of responsibility. When students do not follow the general guidelines for behavior, the following will occur:

* The problem will be discussed with the student using a problem solving approach: What is the problem? What are some solutions for solving the problem? Which one would work? Which will you try?

* If the problem persists, the problem solving approach will again be used with the student and parents will be notified. Referral may be made to the CDA and/or administration. An appropriate plan of action to improve the student's behavior will be determined which may include staying in at recess, working as a volunteer with students, walking with the supervisor, or in severe cases, an in-school or out-of-school suspension.

* Depending on the nature, severity and frequency of the problem, other resource people such as counsellors, administrators, psychologist, Family Liaison Workers or police may be called to work with the parents and the school.

* In known cases of bullying, attempts will be made to counsel both the victim and the offender.

Parent Volunteers are an important part of any elementary school. We are very fortunate to enjoy the help of an army of volunteers in Crossfield Elementary. Many are able to help out during school hours, while others are able to work on projects after school hours. Every effort is appreciated. We encourage all parents to get involved in their children's education.

The School Council meets once a month. The council consists of parents from Crossfield Elementary School.

School Telephones

School phones are for business use. Students have access to classroom phones to contact parents for illness or forgotten items. Students will not be permitted to make changes to home time routines after school. We ask that alternate arrangements (play dates) be made at home with the parents in the evenings.

Breakfast for Learning

Crossfield Elementary School is pleased to offer a Healthy Foods Program for all of our students. We all know that breakfast is one of the most important meals of the day. At Crossfield Elementary School all students have access to a nutritious breakfast five days a week. Students enjoy a variety of fresh breads/toast/porridge, fruit, cereal, or eggs as they learn about nutrition and healthy food choices. Breakfast is free of charge and is offered in the morning starting at 8:30 AM.

Parking and Drop-off

Getting students to and from school safely is a big concern for all of us. For this reason, it is important that parents assist us by dropping off and picking up students in designated locations. Here are the preferred pick-up and drop-off locations:

- In the designated areas
- Parents are permitted to pick up and drop off in the north end of the school parking lot
- Please remember drop-off zones are not parking they are a 15 minute drop off and go zone

Please do not stop, drop off, or pick up:

- in the crosswalk
- anywhere in the "yellow zone"
- in the bus lane north of the school

We do have a crossing guard patrol in the morning and after school so please use the crosswalks whenever you or your children cross the road.



CES Dress Code

Children are sent outside for recess in all but the most severe, inclement weather, so they should be appropriately dressed. For cold days, this means mitts, hats, scarves, boots, a warm jacket and snow pants. On wet or rainy days children should wear waterproof boots and waterproof jacket and 'splash' pants. Parents are asked to ensure their children are appropriately and respectfully dressed for a school context. All clothing, shoes, boots, books, lunch kits, etc. should be clearly marked with the child's name and grade. To assist our custodians in keeping the school clean, students must have two pairs of footwear; one for outside and one for inside. The inside pair; if they are of the soft soled type, may also be used for physical education classes. Hats should be removed upon entering the building and individual teachers will determine if hats may be worn in their classrooms.
